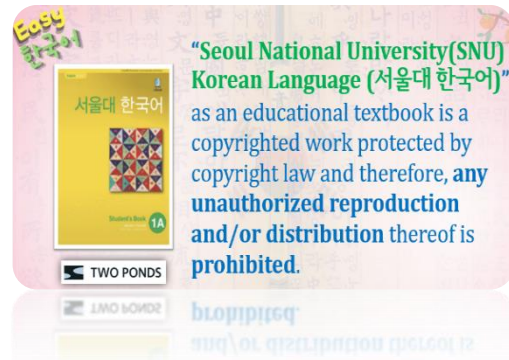
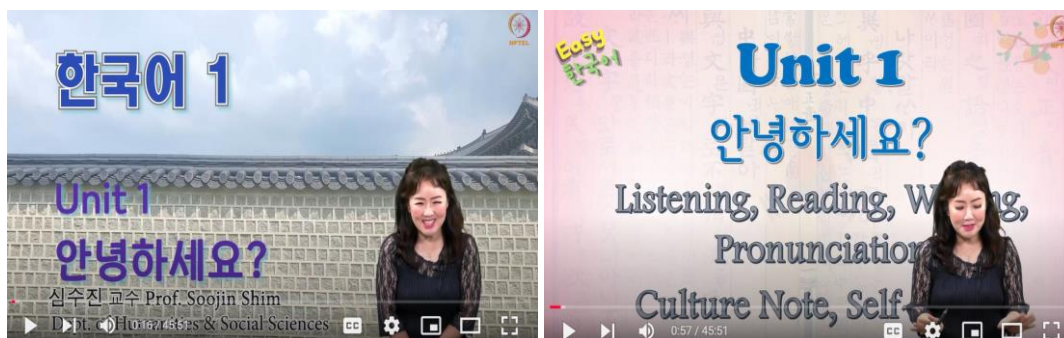


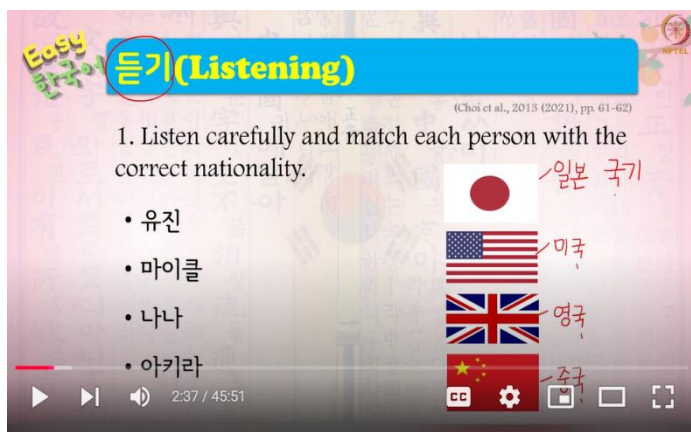

Oreunjok, oenjjok, annyeong, annyeong! Uri NPTEL chinguegedo insahaeyo. Annyeonghaseyo, annyeong- two kinds, okay? Sijak, annyeonghaseyo, annyeong. Look at the camera, joayo, jalhaesseoyo.



Today is the last session for unit 1, okay? Ne, we'll cover Listening, Reading, Writing, Pronunciation, Cultural notes and Self-check. We're busy, bappayo (바빠요), okay. So, shall we start with 'deutgi'? Deutgi (듣기) is listening, okay, say it together, deutgi {deutgi} deutgi {deutgi} deutgi {deutgi}, okay, deutgi. Deutgi is listening. So today I will show my handwriting, but next time, okay, you can come here and then you can write something here. Is it okay for you? Ne, okay, let's try, uh jeoneun Indo saramimnida. Haksangimnida. Gamsahamnida. Okay? Try, try there, okay? And NPTEL students, you have to pause



this lecture video for a moment and then try to write, okay? Ne, joayo. What was it? What was our sentence? Jeoneun, jeoneun, okay, jeoneun, jeoneun, Indo saram, okay. Indo saram, jeoneun Indo saram, saramimnida. Jeoneun Indo saramimnida, is it okay? Jeoneun Indo saramimnida, and then? Haksangimnida, haksangimnida, haksangimnida, haksangimnida. 'Heu (ㅎ)'- 'a'- 'hak', 'sae', 'saeng', Haksang 'ib-ni-da'.

Okay, haksangimnida, haksangimnida, haksangimnida, joayo, ne. And the last one, thank you, gamsahamnida. Let's write, gam gam gam, ga, ga first, ga- 'geu' (ㄱ), 'a' (ㅇ). This is gam, right? Gam, gamsa. Oh no, sa, right in saranghae. Okay, sa, gamsa, gamsa, hamnida, hamnida. Ha ha ha ha, 'heu' [ㅎ], 'a' (ㅇ), okay, hap- ni- da. Long stroke, okay, gamsahamnida, jeoneun Indo saramimnida. Haksangimnida, gamsahamnida. Okay, very good, okay, write your name in Korean, okay? Ne, ireumdo ireum sseuseyo, ireum ireum, name, ne jalhaesseoyo, jalhaesseoyo...

Hmmhmm... are you done? You're done? Okay, can you come here and write one sentence? Ne, uri 'gamsahamnida' sseo bolkkayo (써 볼까요)? Gamsahamnida? Blue, yes, okay, gamsahamnida, gamsahamnida. Okay... okay, okay, good, good. Gam sa, sa long, long, long, long, okay, okay, long, long. Gamsahap- uh, this one first top, top first. Okay, yes, okay, top-down, top-down left-right, left-right -'hap'-ni' long long long long 'ni'- da long, okay. Jalhaesseo, jalhaesseo, baksu! Yeah, jalhaesseoyo, okay ne, jalhaesseoyo yeoreobun. Uh, okay, let's try 'hap', hap, okay? Hap, hap, hap, okay hap, hap, how can you write it? Top first, hana dul, and then circle this is heu, right, hana dul set, a, a ha, this is ha and bieup, bieup this is bieup bieup, we call the name of this consonant bieup, bieup (비읍). Beu (ㅂ), right top-down, top-down left-right, left-right, okay? Okay, one more time, sijak, top-down, top-down, left-right, left-right, hana dul set net. Dasi sijak, hana, dul, set, net. Very good, very good, jalhaesseoyo, jalhaetseumnida, okay, aju jalhaesseoyo.

Now we can see culture note. Culture Note, okay this culture note is about Korean greeting you already know you know Korean greeting, right? What do you remember now? Annyeonghaseyo, annyeonghasimnikka? Annyeonghi gaseyo, annyeonghi gyeseyo okay, that's very good. So this is annyeonghaseyo situation, right? Can you see? Ne, annyeonghaseyo situation, so what's the difference between this one and this one? The first one, first situation, formal okay, formal, this is more formal, right, and this one casual, casual, this is a bit, you know, casual and this one is formal, formal, more formal and, you know he, he is doing like you know, belly button belly button greeting, okay? Annyeonghaseyo, OK she looks like, you know seonsaengnim, she, she looks like seonsaengnim, she is much older than him, right? That's why, okay, annyeonghaseyo? Belly button, belly button greeting, okay, how about them? They, they look like friends, friends, right, that's why, annyeong, annyeong, okay to your friend now, sijak, annyeong oreunjok, oenjok annyeong. Dasi dasi sijak, annyeong, annyeong. OK, this is casual, casual kind of, you know, version, alright next one, this one okay, see this one, this one, you know this one as well, right, first one, first one is formal, formal, very formal, very formal setting. This one, casual, casual or informal, informal or casual, okay. So, but did you see this one, this one, umm? Shaking hands, but with two hands, two hands, okay, with two hands. Joel, can you come here, come here, can you come here? We can demonstrate. Let us suppose that he is much older than me. I look much older than him, but yeah, just, you know, imagine, he has got, you know, kind of, you know, higher social status, and then I met him, okay. I met him, and then I can greet like, you know, very politely, very politely, annyeonghaseyo, bangapseumnida, okay, yeah, like this way, okay.



I can use my both hands, or sometimes, I can use like this like this, okay ne, and then, I can bend more, more than him, all right, more than him, okay. Don't bend, okay, now, you try, okay? I'm an older person, and I have, I've got, you know, higher social status, and then, you try, okay, annyeonghaseyo,

annyeonghaseyo, bangapseumnida, ne, ne, okay, very good, jalhaesseoyo, baksu! Okay, yes, jalhaetseumnida, okay. But informal, informal situation, casual situation, okay, bangawoyo, just, you know, you don't need to bend much, right, okay, just, you know, bangawoyo, okay, nodding, or just, you know, eye contact, okay, bangawoyo.

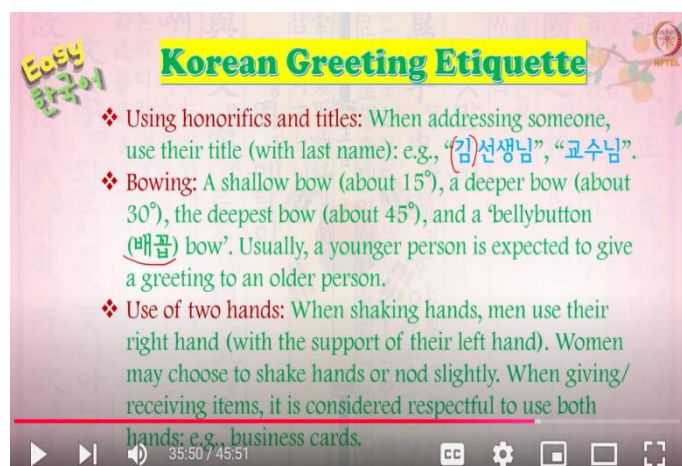
Bangawo, okay, bangawo between friends, okay, ne, jouseumnida. Bangawoyo, bangapseumnida, bangawoyo, okay, and this one, this one. What kind of situation here? This one? It's a kind of, you know, classroom situation, right, so he looks like a student. She looks like a teacher, right? So he, he raised his hand, I have a question, okay. Jilmun itseumnida (질문 있습니다), and then, he can address her,

So using honorifics and titles, when addressing someone, use their title with last name, okay, Kim seonsaengnim, or sometimes we can just say seonsaengnim, or gyosunim, that's better sometimes, okay. That's good, bowing, we have this bowing culture, right, so we have several kinds of, you know, bows, shallow bow, a shallow bow, about 15 degrees, okay, a deeper bow, about 30 degrees, and the deepest bow, about 45 degrees, and a belly button bow. Belly button, what do we call, belly button? Baekkop, baekkop (배꼽), okay, let's try, belly button, belly button, okay? Belly button, okay? Annyeonghasimnikka? Sijak, annyeonghasimnikka? Ne, jalhaesseoyo, jalhaesseoyo, this belly button bow. Usually a younger person is expected to give a greeting to an older person, got it? Ne, ne, joayo, okay, use of



two hands, when shaking hands, men use their right hand, with the support of their left hand, okay? Women may choose to shake hands or not slightly, okay, but these days, you know, men, whether men or women, you know, they both, you know, shake hands, umm okay. When giving, receiving items, it is considered respectful, use both hands, for example, business cards, when I give my business card to you, okay, I can give like, you know, yeah, imagine this is a business card, and then, with my two hands, both hands, okay? When receiving, when receiving, the same, okay, yeah, both hands, both hands, okay.



Yes, we saw the, you know, separate kinds of bows, okay? I can show you, just a sec, "insa-ui jongnyue daehaeseo arabogetseumnida, insaneun keuge (크게), mongnye (목례), gyeongnye (경례), keun (큰) gyeongnyega (경례가) itseumnida, mongnyeneun jaju majuchige doel tae haneun, saljjak guburineun nuninsaimnida, gyeongnyeneun uriga ilsangsaenghwareseo neul haneun,

samshipdo jeongdoui guburimimnida, keun gyeongnyeneun jeongjunhage keuge haneun, sashipodo jeongdoui guburim insaimnida." Okay, so, first one, first one was, 15 degrees, okay, this is just, you know, nodding, okay, nodding. So, when we run into someone, very often, and then, we can just, you know, nod slightly with eye contact, right, something like this, something like this, okay? But the second one, second one is 30, 30 degrees bow, yeah. We usually use this bow, in our daily lives, okay, so, annyeonghaseyo, this much, okay, annyeonghaseyo? Annyeonghaseyo? Annyeonghasimnikka? Annyeonghaseyo? Okay, okay, how about the last one? {45}, 45, okay. So, when we meet much older, senior person with a higher social status, we can show our respect more, right? Okay. With this bow, sijak, annyeonghaseyo? OK, annyeonghasimnikka? Okay, okay, very good.

Now we will move on to Pronunciation. This is Pronunciation, okay. If you see these example sentences, we can have sentences and questions, right? So, statements have a rising or falling? Statements? Falling, falling, falling intonation. Questions have a rising intonation okay, let's try. Aditteu ssineun Indo saramieyo? Sijak, Aditteu ssineun Indo saramieyo? Han beon deo, Indo saramieyo? Ne, Indo saramieyo. Sijak, ne, Indo saramieyo. Han beon deo, ne, Indo saramieyo, jalhaesseoyo. Maria ssineun uisayeyo? Maria ssineun uisayeyo? Ne, uisayeyo, sijak, ne, uisayeyo. Very good, oh jalhaesseoyo.

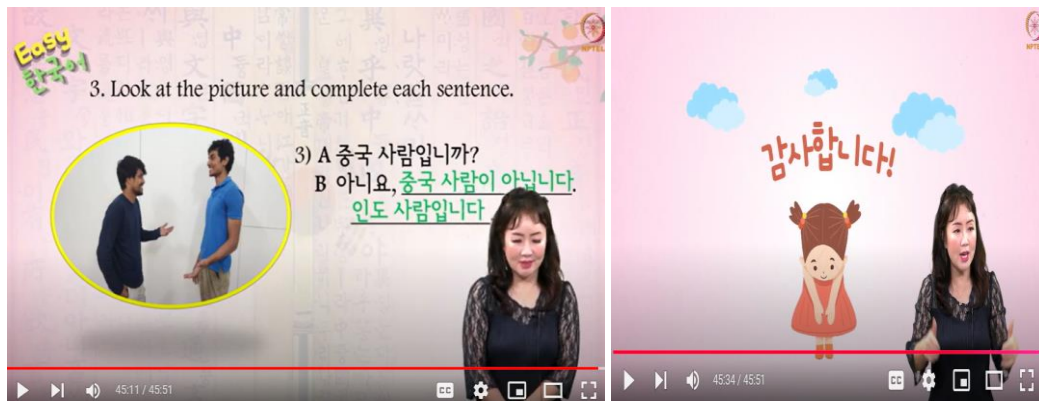
